"On the night of October 5th and 6th he was in charge of No. 1 semi-Portable on the Grand Drine, and was in the act of firing when a bomb burst on the parapet in the front of the machine, and the concussion knocked him backward and the machine with him. The machine fell from its platform onto its side, a distance of about four feet. Sapper Denholm fell to the bottom of the trench, a distance of about ten feet, but was not seriously injured."
